Research has found this is the most effective response for preventing school-based behaviour problems, including school violence and bullying. Teaching and supporting social behavioural skills to students creates student behavioural health and also contributes to academic support systems.

#### **WODONGA HOLIDAY CLINIC 2017**


The PlayNRL Holiday Clinic is a day program for kids aged 5-16 of any gender that focuses on fun, fitness and participation.
