



Communication with Teachers

Parents are welcome to email or call their child's teacher to receive feedback about their child's progress in class. We encourage you to regularly communicate with the teachers so you can support your child at home.

Students who witness bullying can make a difference! (adapted from the DET website)

Many students are bystanders in bullying situations, these bystanders need support to deal with what they have seen or know is taking place.

Bystander concerns include:

- not knowing what to do or not wanting to make the situation worse
- not knowing if their actions will make a difference
- feeling worried about their safety if they intervene
- feeling worried about the impact of taking action on their
- being anxious that they will be bullied as a result of intervening.

Research shows that peers are present in 85 per cent of bullying Hockey incidents at school. Bullying has been shown to stop within 10 seconds when bystanders take positive action.

If your child reports to you that they are a witness to bullying you should encourage your child to take action or report this to the a teacher in the school.

If bullying happens online or via text messages outside school report it to the school, especially if other children from the school are involved or it is making your child uncomfortable at school.

As a College we are aware of the potential harmful effects of bullying, including cyberbullying, on young people and take reports of bullying seriously.

Everyone within the school community can work together to help create a climate where bullying is not acceptable. Thank you for your support.

Leadership Breakfast

A group of students from Felltimber and Huon braved a very frosty morning to attend the first Leadership Breakfast sponsored by Wodonga Council on Thursday morning at 7.30am. While they tucked into a very healthy breakfast the two guest speakers, Luke and Laura Owens shared their stories. Luke spoke about Youth Homelessness in



his home town of Bendigo and how it impacts on young people's lives. With what started as a fundraising idea, Luke and a group of friends went on to raise \$100,000 in 12 months which in turn was matched by other corporate sponsors and Government

funds with the final amount being six million dollars. Bendigo now has a purpose built complex to support the homeless.

Laura Owens shared her story of going to Uganda with a group of friends to help women in poor villages to start small scale businesses. They did this

by loaning them small amounts of money and providing training to make the businesses sustainable. What again started as a small idea for a handful of women has now grown to many women in a number of villages and with future plans to build a school with the profits to provide education close to the village. Both Luke and Laura said they both faced challenges and difficulties in each of the projects but they still went ahead and learnt on the go. The message was 'believe in what you want to achieve and go for it'. The reward is the change you make in the lives of others and your own life for the better.
