

Principal's Report

Professional Learning Communities, student voice

Late last year, a group of teachers from Wodonga Middle Years College joined with all schools in the Wodonga Federation of Government Schools (Wodonga Primary School, Wodonga South Primary School, Melrose Primary School, Wodonga West Primary School, Baranduda Primary School, Belvoir Specialist School and Wodonga Senior Secondary College) to undertake professional development in *Professional Learning Communities*. This initiative brings teachers within schools together to learn from their peers, drawing on evidence and evaluating the impact of their practice on student learning.

This week we had Hollie Kane come from Department of Education to interview students and staff about our progress with Professional Learning Communities. The feedback was very positive and this feedback gave us the opportunity to evaluate our progress and look at the next steps in our journey.

Our leadership students have also been working on a "teach the teacher" initiative and will run a whole staff meeting on how they learn best. They will give us some tips on how to teach them that we may not have thought of before. We are really looking forward to this presentation and it will be a great opportunity for students to have a voice.

Year 9 into 10 Transition

This Wednesday, June 14, our Year 9 students will attend Wodonga Senior Secondary College (WSSC) as part of their transition to Year 10. They will have tours of the college and attend their regular Discovery and Communications classes throughout the day.

Outdoor Education


Mountain Biking
