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


Year 8

Outdoor Education




Huon fielded both boys and girls Year 7 Hockey teams in last week's Upper Hume Competition. The Year 7 Huon Boys Hockey team continued the form of





by winning their way through to Hume Level next term. The girls team wasn't so lucky. All students were a credit to the College – well done.






Student Leadership
