


Joy Starr who pulled together a series of calendars and a wonderful

the Climbing and Ropes course. It was all on! Lots of laughs and cheering helped us work up a huge appetite for a delicious healthy lunch.


We dived into platters of wraps and subs, loaded with salads, hams and sala -mis. The chatter increased as new friends were made from other schools, and young people added friends to their
