## Principal's Report

#### Welcome for 2018

Last week we welcomed back staff and students to Wodonga Middle Years College for the 2018 school year. I am sure students are all ready for their next learning challenges and continually improving themselves as not only learners but as citizens. All students have been allocated to new houses.

Over the holidays a number of things were done around the College to improve facilities. At Huon there has been some tree safety and work on D wing and the new English Language Centre at the end of A Wing has started to take shape. At Felltimber there has been general maintenance work and tree safety. I would like to thank the many staff who worked at the College over the holidays, there are often many teachers in at work during their break organising their classrooms and preparing curriculum. Also to our grounds staff Tim, Helena and Simon who carefully looked after the grounds and kept watering and mowing over the long hot break. Cindy Ellis, our Human Resources Manager who ensures that all our staffing and budgeting is set for the start of the school year and Ricky Montgomery our Information Technology Manager who completes upgrades during the break and works with staff to get the Information Technology right before students and staff return.

#### The Wodonga Way! - C.A.R.E.

At Wodonga Middle Years College, we care for each student. This year we will continue sending text messages to parents when students are absent and the school has not been notified by a parent. This is a way of ensuring that each student is accounted for and parents are

aware when students are absent. We thank families for working with us by contacting the College regarding their child's absence and welcome any feedback.

We expect positive behaviours from our students at Wodonga Middle Years College and we explicitly teach these values through our CARE program. **C** stands for Care for relationships; **A** stands for Achievement through Aspiration; **R** stands for Respect and Resilience; and **E** stands for Engagement. The CARE program assists us to teach students expected social behaviours. Research has found this is the most effective response for preventing school-based behaviour problems including school violence and bullying. Teaching and supporting social behavioural skills to students creates student behavioural health and also contributes to academic support systems.

Ask your child if they have received a C.A.R.E. reward this week!

#### Contacting your child at school

As adults we know it is often difficult to avoid the distraction of our phone and other devices when at work; it is even more difficult for our children. Students at Wodonga Middle Years College are encouraged to avoid distractions whilst learning in class time. Some class teachers will even ask students to turn all notifications off their devices during class time.

When you need to contact your child during the school day could you please do so through the front office rather than contact your child directly via social media or text message. This way we can

minimise distractions for our students. Students must also sign in and out of school through the front office. To further reduce interruptions during class time we are unable to use the PA system, unless it is a matter of emergency. If you require your child to be excused from class, please send them with a signed note to school to present to their teacher so they may be excused. The PA system will only be used during break times wherever possible. Thank you for your cooperation with these matters.

#### Insurance

WMYC wishes to advise parents that the Department does not provide accident insurance or ambulance cover for students. The cost of any medical attention or ambulance for a student will be borne by the parent/guardian – this includes transport costs such as ambulance or air ambulance costs. We recommend that where possible, parents ensure they have ambulance cover included with their health insurance or take out separate cover with Ambulance Victoria.

There are several insurance companies that offer student accident insurance cover. (Neither WMYC nor the Department necessarily endorses these companies.)

Private property brought to school by students or visitors is not insured and the Department does not accept any responsibility for any loss or damage.

This can include mobile phones, calculators, toys, sporting equipment and cars parked on school premises. As the Department does not hold insurance for personal property brought to schools and has no capacity to pay for any loss or damage to such property, students and staff should be discouraged from bringing any unnecessary or particularly valuable items to school.


#### Australian Army Cadets



# **FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS**

## My child has lost their information sheet, so I don't have their shootkey. What should I do?

Your school administration has a list of all students' unique shootkeys. They will be able to issue the key to you again.

## My child never received an information sheet or shootkey.

This is likely because your child was a late enrolment, or a new student. If you call MSP Photography on 03 5482 3190 we can issue you one immediately.

## Can I also order if my partner and I have separated?

Of course. Simply use the same shootkey to order for your child. Any students with multiple orders processed will have their photographs sent to the front office of the school to ensure orders are delivered to the correct parent.

### How do I order a family photo?

Each student has been issued with a corresponding unique shootkey for a family photo. Order using the shootkey on the <u>oldest child's</u> information sheet. Record your order reference number, and be sure to fill out the family details in the section provided on the <u>oldest child's</u> information sheet There is no need to record it on all siblings' sheets.

## I didn't receive an order reference number, but the money has been taken out of my bank account.

Your order will automatically be received by our system. Simply send your child on photo day with their information sheet as normal.

### I can't pay today. Will I still be able to get photos?

Of course. All students will have their portrait taken regardless of whether you are purchasing photos or not. Online ordering will remain open for 3 calendar days after photo day. If you are still unable to order in this time frame, please contact us and we will endeavour to help you out.
