#### Attendance CSEF (Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund)



Staff member Helena Foster has been overseeing the garden and the harvesting of its fruits and vegetables from the ground up. Students regularly tend to the garden, learning about what's involved in growing the produce and then how to best utilise it in the kitchen, with the students turning their harvest into sellable items at markets and in the foyer of the Felltimber campus front office.

"One of the aspects of the project is to teach the students about sustainability" said Helena "Students really like to see the plants growing and then to see how that can be used in their cooking classes, it's exciting" she

said. On Tuesday Helena, Year 7 student Mason Stanley and Katy Meiklejohn were in the kitchen, taking some of the Eggplants that they had harvested earlier in the morning and using them to make an Indian dish.
