Year 7


Last week a number of WMYC Year 7 students engaged in the second round of the Youth Leadership Program at the CUBE.

improve brain function to support learning and goal settina. Healthy eating, exercise, leisure and rest were all topics up for discussion about how making


small changes in daily our life can become great life habits for
