Communication with Teachers

Parents are welcome to email or call their child's teacher to receive feedback about their child's progress in class. We encourage you to regularly communicate with the teachers so you can support your child at home.

Students who witness bullying can make a difference! (adapted from the DET website)

Many students are bystanders in bullying situations, these bystanders need support to deal with what they have seen or know is taking place.

Bystander concerns include:

· not knowing what to do or not wanting to make the situation worse

· not knowing if their actions will make a difference

· feeling worried about their safety if they intervene

· feeling worried about the impact of taking action on their friendships

· being anxious that they will be bullied as a result of intervening.

Research shows that peers are present in 85 per cent of bullying incidents at school. Bullying has been shown to stop within 10 seconds when bystanders take positive action.

If your child reports to you that they are a witness to bullying you should encourage your child to take action or report this to the a teacher in the school.

If bullving happens online or via text messages outside school report it to the school, especially if other children from the school are involved or it is making your child uncomfortable at school.

As a College we are aware of the potential harmful effects of bullying, including cyberbullying, on young people and take reports of bullying seriously.

Everyone within the school community can work together to help create a climate where bullying is not acceptable. Thank you for your support.

Online safety

Keeping our kids safe Online- What to do if your child sees something online that is offensive

Talking to your kids about the sites they visit is important in helping protect them against the impact of viewing unsuitable content. Be aware of how they use the internet and discuss the sites and apps that are okay to explore and those that are not. You can teach your child strategies about how to deal with offensive material but be vigilant, especially if your child is prone to taking risks or is emotionally or psychologically vulnerable. You can support your child by:

• teaching them to leave or close the page immediately or minimise the screen if they are worried about the material they have seen (hit Control-Alt-Delete if the site does not allow you to exit)

• encouraging them to talk to a trusted adult if they have seen something online that makes them upset, disturbed or distressed

• reassuring them that access to the internet will not be denied if they report seeing inappropriate content

• reminding them not to open spam email or click on pop ups, prize offers or unfamiliar hyperlinks in websites

• telling them not to respond if they are sent something inappropriate

• keeping them connected to trusted friends and family online and offline.

Online safety is important for the whole family. Allowing your child to access online information is important, however it is recommended you monitor what your child is accessing and when. It is recommended that you regularly monitor what and when they access information. Open family areas within the family house work best for children accessing online information.
