2018 Parent Opinion Survey

Tell us what you think.

Our school is conducting a survey to find out what parents think of our school. The parent Opinion survey is an annual survey offered by the Department of Education and Training that is conducted amongst a sample of randomly selected parents. It is designed to assist schools in gaining an understanding of parents' perceptions of school climate, student behaviour and student engagement. Our school will use the survey results to help inform and direct future school planning and improvement strategies.

Approximately 30 percent of parents will be invited to participate in this year's survey. All responses to the survey are anonymous. This year the parent Opinion Survey will be conducted from Monday July 23, to Sunday August 26, 2018.

The survey will be conducted online, only takes 10-15 minutes to complete and can be accessed at any time within the time period on desktop computers, laptop, tablets or smartphones.

Results of the survey will be reported back to the school at the end of September.

Community Visits

Last term a number of Defence students visited different welfare community organisations to find out what they do in the community, as well as learn more about some of the 'hidden' issues



faced by many local families and young people - such as homelessness and food shortages.

In the first week, Carevan CEO Stacey Franklin visited the school and talked about the origins of Carevan, what they do, programs they run, and opportunities to volunteer with them.

This was followed by a visit and tour of the local Foodshare facility; then a visit to the Carevan depot where students were able to make up salads to go to the meals for the homeless that night, as well as make packs of essential toiletry items to be distributed to those living on the streets.

The next week, the students visited the YES Unlimited offices in



Albury and learnt about the many programs and services that they offer locally.

The final week concluded with another visit to the Carevan depot for some more salad making and care pack making.

Students' eyes were definitely opened to some of the hidden social issues experienced by large numbers of people locally.

There will be further opportunity for Defence students to be engaged in the community during Term 3, when a Meals on Wheels run will occur each Wednesday that students can volunteer for.

Late last term, our student leaders attended a Youth Leadership breakfast at Wodonga Council. The guest speaker was Maree Cables, Director/Franchisee of McDonalds Albury, Lavington, Wodonga, Birallee and Corowa. Maree shared her very diverse career journey with the students. She started her working life in office administration, then travelled and worked abroad for a couple of years before taking up studies for nursing. Later, in her
