Principal's Report

Huon Building Regeneration

On Thursday 13th September Bill Tilly MLA and Tim Smith MP (Member for Kew and Shadow Education Minister) attended the Huon Campus to meet with Paul Thorpe (School Council President), Michael Grohmann (School Captain) and myself. They annouced that if their party is elected in November they will promise \$5 million to begin the redevelopment at the Huon Campus. This is great news for Wodonga Middle Years College as we are currently operating in buildings that are becoming increasingly difficult to maintain. They certainly do not reflect the great teaching and learning that is happening in our College.

This will mean that we can begin planning in 2019 with the first stage of building in 2020. The first stage of building will most likely comprise of a new Arts, Technology wing. The plan is to relocate the new buildings to the Wilson Street side of the school to ease congestion in Mitchell street.

Bullying

At our school council meeting last week, we passed the Federation bullying policy. Often there are some distressing events that occur in our lives. It is important to remind ourselves of what bullying is not.

Many distressing behaviours are not examples of bullying even though they are unpleasant and often require teacher intervention and management.

- Mutual conflict: involves an argument or disagreement between people but not an imbalance of power. Both parties are upset and usually both want a resolution. Unresolved mutual conflict can develop into bullying if one of the parties targets the other repeatedly in retaliation.
- Social rejection or dislike: is not bullying unless it involves deliberate and repeated attempts to cause distress, exclude or create dislike by others.
- Single-episode acts: of nastiness or physical aggression are not the same as bullying. If someone is verbally abused or pushed on one occasion they are not being bullied. Nastiness or physical aggression that is directed towards many different people is not the same as bullying. However, this does not mean that single episodes of nastiness or physical aggression should by ignored or condoned as these are unacceptable behaviour.


