

What is the NDIS?

The National Disability Insurance Scheme (NDIS) is run by the government to help people with a permanent and significant disability live a better life.

The NDIS lets people decide what they need to be more involved in the community and everyday life.

Hannah's Story

Hannah's mother and teachers see that she is having trouble learning like the other children. She doesn't like to talk much and can't write. Hannah isn't doing well at school, and can't learn the way the rest of her class do.

Hannah may have a permanent and significant disability.

Her mother is worried about her. She and her teachers want her to do well at school.

Hannah is getting special help with her learning. She is doing better at school and is looking forward to getting a job.

Why do we need the NDIS?

People with a disability have the same rights as other Australians, and should be able to make choices about what support is best for them.

The NDIS recognises that everyone has different goals and needs, and works with people to help them achieve their goals and enjoy an ordinary life.

The NDIS is replacing the disability system with a new national system.

The NDIS is social insurance and is not welfare. The NDIS takes a lifetime approach to support, investing in people with disability early to improve their life later on.
