

### **Principal's Report**

### It's Not OK to be Away

The time is right to focus on improved attendance rates at trades, these ranged from Wodonga Middle Years College

Last year on average each student was absent for 24.6 days. This means that on average each student will miss nearly a term and a half of learning during their time at our school. By the end of their time at WSSC the average student at our school will miss 3 terms of school.

Local and international research demonstrates a strong correlation between students' learning, longer-term life outcomes and attendance at school and appropriate participation in education programs.

It is important that children develop habits of regular attendance from an early age, as the older a child gets the more difficult it can be to establish new habits.

Poor patterns of attendance place students at risk of not achieving their educational, social and future potential as adults. Once learners have begun to absent themselves from pre-school or school, and the initial cause of this remains undetected or unresolved, it is likely that the pattern of absence will continue and escalate through their subsequent schooling

Please remember that if you are experiencing difficulty in having your child attend school, discuss the matter with your child's CARE teacher, a House Leader or Assistant Principal.



### **VEX Robotics**

#### **USA Tour**

On ANZAC day 10 students from Huon, Felltimber and WSSC embarked on the trip of a lifetime to the USA to compete in the VEX World Championships. Our 3690F team were amongst 1,200 teams from around the world



competing for the World Championship title. Our team competed in the MATH division with 80 other teams, this division was one of 6 VEX IQ Middle School divisions in the competition with a total of

teams. To put that into scale, the Australian Nationals were ran in December last year and had only 100 teams across all VEX IQ and VRC in all three age groups of Elementary, Middle Years and High School. Our team played ten matches in the qualification rounds achieving a personal best score of 32 points (the



winning score at the Australian Nationals was 27 points) this was not enough to get them into the finals and they finished 69th in their division. The team that ended up winning the World Championship title scored 41

points. This was a great opportunity to meet people from all around the world, with many new friendships formed. We were also fortunate to visit NASA, getting up close to many different space craft and getting the opportunity to experience lift-off in a simulator. We hope to be able to qualify for the World Championships in 2020.
