Dr Michael Carr Gregg, adolescent psychologist suggests that about 1-2 hours of recreational use on line per day is acceptable. Parents should implement safety controls on all devices in the house, these controls can block sexually explicit site, set screen time limits, block in-app purchases, block numbers and SMS, allow or block websites, restrict chat features, and allow parental monitoring. www.esafety.gov.au

Students from VCAL Personal Development are running the 'Winter Solstice Movie Night' as a way to engage youth in the conversation about suicide, mental health and wellbeing. To raise awareness. To prevent death by suicide.

The reason Murray United are the ambassadors is because young Australian men are more likely to take their own life than die in a motor vehicle accident. There are over 3000 deaths by suicide annually, more than eight people per day. Beyond Blue reports that six of the eight are men...... the numbers are sad, astonishing and increasing. However suicide does not discriminate, 85% of Australians know someone who has died by suicide. Lets shine a light on the darkest night. Thank you for your support.
