Principal's Report

Return to Face to Face Teaching

We are very excited to return all students and staff to face to face teaching this week. Our staff worked hard last week to ensure that the school is set up in readiness for students to return this week. We thank them for their efforts.

This term will be focussed on settling students back into the school routine and continuing the learning program that has been set out for students.

Your child may find it difficult to adjust back to regular routines and household rules. As a parent you will need to re-establish those rules and norms in your house. This will be a difficult time for families. Ensure that you are setting boundaries while ensuring a close connection with your child.

Consider how your child might be feeling, validate these feelings. For example: "It must be difficult to get up earlier when you have been able to sleep longer during the past 6 months."

As parents and carers remain calm, clear and in control.

Please contact the school if you are having trouble motivating your child to come to school and we can put supports in place if required.

We look forward to having everyone back on site this week. This will be an opportunity for students to strengthen their relationships with each other and their teachers.

While most students will adjust to the return to on-site learning without requiring additional support, we are mindful that some students may need support with their social and emotional wellbeing, or to maintain engagement with their academic learning.

Wodonga Middle Years College has a range of approaches we use to ensure we are providing all students with the support they need.

As always, we will let you know if we identify opportunities to provide further social, academic and behavioural support to your child.

Please let us know if you have any questions about this resource or concerns about how your child is adjusting to the return to on-site learning.

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Parent Opinion Survey

We Want Our Parents to Tell Us What They Think!

Our school is conducting a survey to find out what parents think of our school. The Parent Opinion Survey is an annual survey offered by the Department of Education and Training that is conducted amongst all parents. It is designed to assist schools in gaining an understanding of parents' perceptions of school climate, student behaviour, student engagement and experiences of remote and flexible learning. Our school will use the survey results to help inform and direct future school planning and improvement strategies.

All parents will be invited to participate in this year's survey. All responses to the survey are anonymous. This year, the Parent Opinion Survey will be conducted from **Monday** 12th October to Friday 13th November.

The survey will be conducted **online**, only takes **20 minutes** to complete, and can be accessed at any convenient time within the fieldwork period on desktop computers, laptops, tablets or smartphones. Please speak to your child's teacher if you would like more information.
